

Australian Climbing Association New South Wales Inc.

The Association is established solely for these Objects. The Objects of the Association are to:

1. To be the pre-eminent representative body for climbing access in New South Wales.
2. To accumulate monies obtained from membership fees and donations into a trust fund, (the 'access fund'), to be used for matters that affect rights to access climbing sites in New South Wales and contribute to broader access issues in Australia
3. To accumulate monies obtained from donations into a trust fund, (the 'crag care fund') that can be used for crag stewardship activities in NSW and matters that affect the crag environment.
4. To ensure that the legislation, regulations, policy documents and other instruments which affect climbing are lawful and appropriate and are being correctly interpreted and applied by land managers.
5. To work with land managers and governments at all levels to promote and support climbing and to help develop climbing related policy, regulations and other instruments.
6. To work with climbers to form and maintain a strong climbing community and to support the education of climbers in appropriate crag behaviour and stewardship.
7. To ensure the full recreational value of land managed under the Forestry Act 2012, National Park Estate (Land Transfers) Act 1998, National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974, Crown Land Management Act 2016, Coastal Management Act 2016 and Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 plus such public lands that are held in freehold by local governments is recognised and utilised.
8. To work with Traditional Owners to communicate an understanding of Aboriginal Cultural Heritage to climbers, and to ensure that the requirements of the Aboriginal Land Rights Act 1983 are being correctly interpreted and applied by land managers.
